Garden Happy! Holiday Decorating Workshop

Thanksgiving is a time to gather with friends and family and give thanks for the love and abundance in our lives. There is an abundance of beautiful things nature has provided too, right outside our door!

Our **2-hour workshop** will focus on creating Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday arrangements using natural materials. <u>Everyone will be making a "Fall-to-Christmas"</u> <u>arrangement to take home</u>. I will provide foam, greenery, fresh flowers and other supplies, and demonstrate the mechanics of putting things together. <u>Please bring your hand pruners</u> <u>and a container</u> for your arrangement (I have extra ones if you don't have a favorite.)

Also feel free to bring anything you would like to include in your arrangement -- a special bow to match the color of your dining room, Spanish moss you brought back from the beach, berries from shrubs in your yard, candles, artichokes, fruit, or interesting dried stuff you picked on the side of the road. It is a great adventure going outside to gather decorations. You may be surprised with what you discover. Your collection of "found" treasures will keep you smiling right through the winter holidays.

Just to give you some ideas, below is a list of plant material I use for winter decorations.

Class will be taught inside my workshop with a cozy wood burning stove, hot drinks & holiday sweets. Please dress for the weather and plan to arrive early to allow time to park and gather. <u>Class will begin promptly at 2pm.</u>

You may also want to bring a pen and paper, camera, and money (cash, check, or credit card). I will have outdoor container arrangements for sale, potted amaryllis bulbs, high-quality photo greeting cards packaged for gifts, and pass-along plants from my garden.

Directions from downtown Greensboro:

Follow Battleground Ave north, continue north on Lawndale Drive, continue north on Lake Brandt Road. Continue 1 mile after you cross Rt. 150 and turn right on Witty Road which is at the bottom of the hill. Go 1 mile up Witty. My driveway is on the right immediately at the end of the fenced pasture. The entrance is landscaped with boulders & a short rock wall. 8110 mailbox is on left. (If you get to Scalesville Road you have gone too far.)
